AMERICAN INDIAN ART

Explore the rich heritage of American Indian art in our exhibition, 'To Honor the Plains Nations.' Highlighting exquisite pieces from the renowned Gallatin and Brinton collections, this showcase brings together treasures that have captivated audiences for over 45 years at the Art Institute of Chicago. Now, these revered artifacts return to their roots in Big Horn, where they were first assembled on the Gallatin family's ranch beside the Quarter Circle A.

THE BRINTON RANCH

Discover the heart of the 620-acre Quarter Circle A Ranch at the historic Brinton Ranch House. Originally acquired by Bradford Brinton in 1923 as a gentleman's working ranch, it now serves as the repository for his vast collections of art, American Indian artifacts, rare documents, and furnishings. Immerse yourself in their original setting through guided tours. Explore the surrounding outbuildings including the Little Goose Creek Lodge, Saddle and Carriage Barns, and stroll through the picturesque gardens at your leisure. With its manicured grounds, the estate offers a serene backdrop, perfect for weddings and special events.

WESTERN ART

Central to our museum is Bradford Brinton's (1882-1936) original collection of 19th and early 20th-century Western art. Showcasing masterpieces by renowned artists such as Remington and Russell, alongside works from his personal circle including Borein, Gollings, and Kleiber, this collection is a testament to Brinton's passion for the West. Enriched further with historically significant pieces by Moran, Bodmer, Wimar, Wittredge, John Mix Stanley, and contemporary artists, it narrates the unique tale of the American West.
